Dear Parent,

Do not panic! You *can* rid your house of lice safely. Try to be patient. It will take at least 2 weeks to be sure you and your family are lice-free. Use this checklist as your guide to lice-freedom for your whole family (at least for the first exposure).

What you will need: Safe home treatment or a lice pediculide (chemical to kill lice), large plastic bags, daily access to a washer and dryer, vacuum cleaner with extra bags, scotch tape, good set of eyes, a bright light, magnifying glass, metal nit comb, lots of patience and a good video for your children to watch, hair clips

Get Rid of Lice Checklist

<u>Day 1</u>

Pull your hair back or cover it with a bandana or plastic shower cap before starting clean-up.

Remove your child's clothing and everyone else's who is in the home right now. Wash **ALL** clothing in hot water and dry in the hottest setting.

Use your home treatment or other pediculide and follow directions very carefully. Be sure to cover child's eyes with a towel. Treat over a sink.

Check your child for more nits/lice by parting and sectioning off the hair. Pull nits out- *all of them* – use the metal nit comb to help pull out nits. Dispose of lice by flushing nits/lice down sink or toilet or by sticking the nits on a piece of tape, fold the tape over and throw away in an outside garbage can. **Nit picking is the most important part of ridding your family of lice.**

□Vacuum entire house and all furniture – *do not forget to empty the vacuum outside!*

Bag all stuffed animals, pillows, etc, which cannot be washed, for two weeks. *Tie a knot.*

All brushes, combs, clips and hair products should be placed in extremely hot water to soak for 20 minutes. **Do not boil hair products as some will melt at this temperature**. Strip beds and wash all sheets, pillow cases, and blankets. Dry in a hot dryer for 20 minutes. Do not forget to vacuum the laundry area, baskets and mattresses.

Vacuum car thoroughly.

 \Box All family members or persons living in the house should be checked for lice.

<u>Day 2</u>

Check your child thoroughly for nits/lice. Remove all nits using the *tape* method.

└──Vacuum floors, furniture and car, again!

Put child's bed sheet and pillowcase in a hot dryer for 20 minutes.

Next 2 Weeks

Daily head checks on everyone in the house, including friends and neighbors that come to visit.

UPut bed sheets, pillowcase/s and pillow/s in hot dryer for 20 minutes every night.

Vacuum daily.

Prevention

Check all children who come over to play with your child. Inform parents if you find nits/lice. Do not let them play together until they are nit-free.

Remind children daily not to share combs, hats, scarves, headphones, hairclips or headbands, etc.

Wear long hair in braids when possible. It is not necessary to cut child's hair.

<u>Remember</u>

NO treatment is 100% effective.

DON'T waste money on lice room spray - can be harmful and doesn't work well.
