- 2. Troi Stith, Tobacco Cessation Coordinator for Lawrence County and Baby & Me Tobacco Free for Orange County, educated the Board on the harmful effects of the e-cigarettes and teen usage.

E-cigarettes are battery powered devices that can deliver nicotine and flavorings to the user in the form of an aerosol. They come in many shapes and sizes. A popular one called a JUUL, is shaped like an USB flash drive and is being used by students in schools. Another one looks much like an Apple watch. The teachers do not even realize the students are using it because they will hold the vapor in their mouth then it will become clear. JUUL nicotine liquid refills are called pods and are available in several flavors such as Cool Cucumber, Fruit Medley, Mango, and Mint. All JUUL e-cigarettes have a high level of nicotine. According to the manufacturer, a single JUUL pod contains as much nicotine as a pack of 20 regular cigarettes. Three deaths in Indiana have been confirmed due to vaping.

Greg Taylor: Where can you buy the watch?

Troi Stith: A lot of them get them off of ebay.

Max Bedwell: How much do they cost?

Troi Stith: Juul pods typically \$50 or can buy 4 for \$15.99.

<u>Rosie Wininger:</u> Where do the kids figure out where to get this?

Troi Sith: Typically older kids buy it then resale at an increased price.

Herman Campbell: Are our legislatures trying to get laws passed to stop this?

Troi Stith: The FDA is trying to buckle down on it but the marketing they are doing now is focusing on older adults when we know the damage has been done. Juul has a big focus on social media and they place ads on the young generation.

Suzanne Brown: Do they get taken away in schools?

Troi Stith: They can and they do. A lot of schools give 3 warnings and a \$125 fine. All schools are different and it is very hard for teachers to catch them doing it.

Janie Johnson: Does BNL have an education course?

Troi Stith: No, but my goal is to get it in there and Mitchell. I feel like I make a difference and if it helps one child then it is worth it.

Max Bedwell: Have you been perceived well by faculty members?

Troi Stith: Last year no but this year yes.

3. The CEO informed the Board of the Stonecutters \$5.5 million loan being paid off.
