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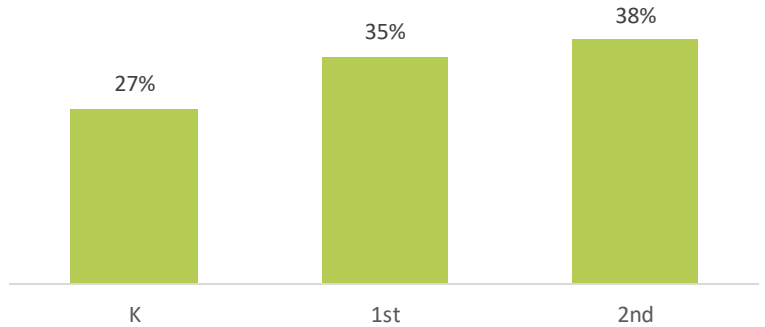

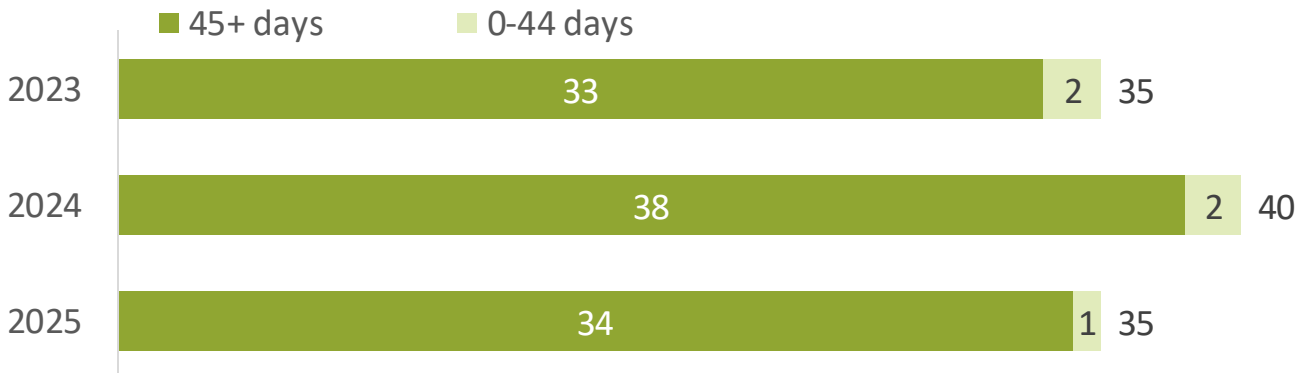
GRADE LEVEL OF PARTICIPATING STUDENTS

During the 2024-2025 school year, the program served 34 students for 45+ days, exceeding the RAP goal of 30 students.



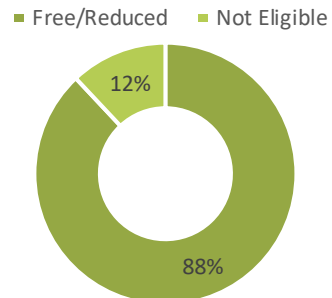
DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

Eligibility for Free/Reduced Lunch



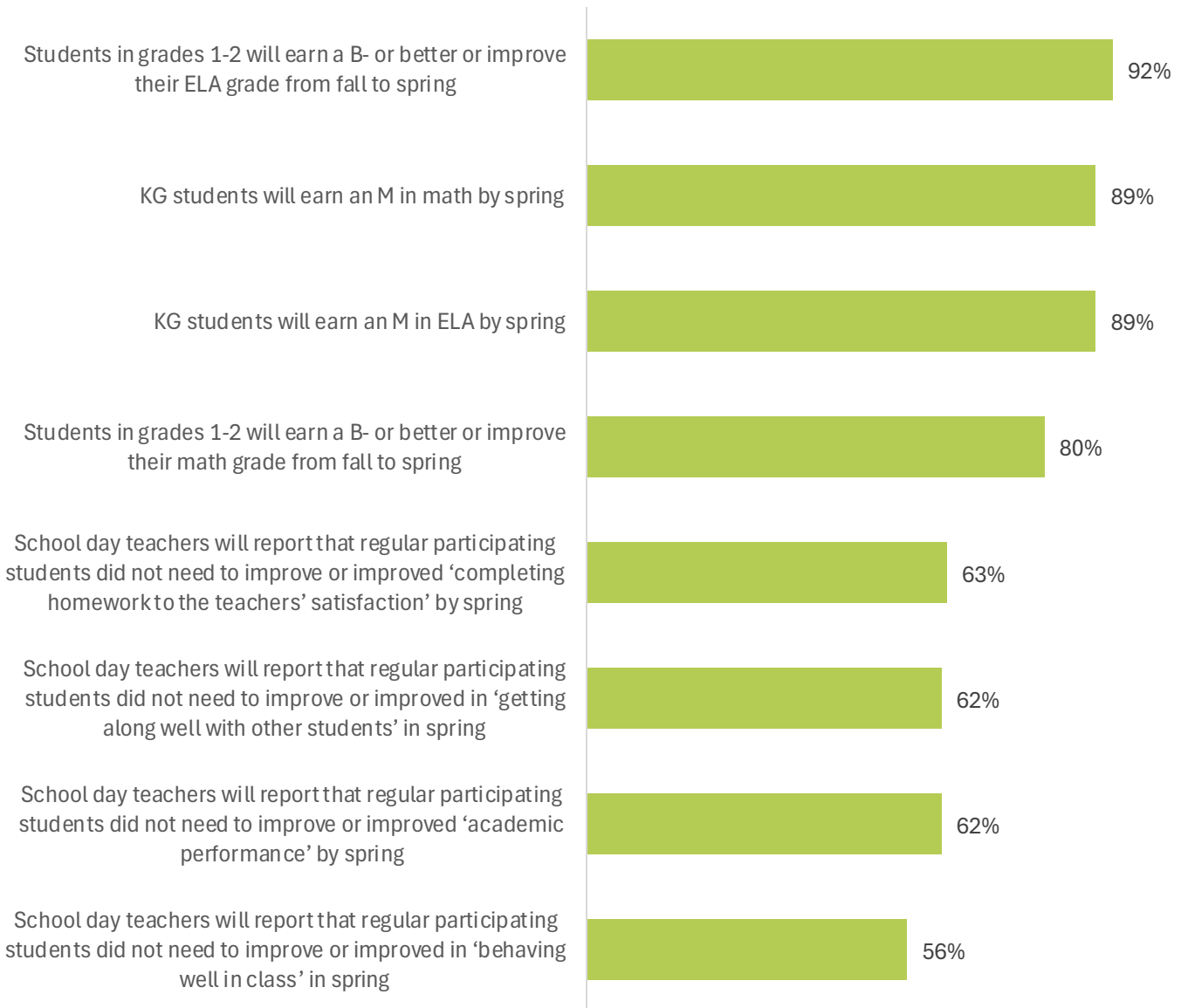
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STUDENT SUCCESS

Academic and social/behavioral outcomes were measured for students who attended 45+ days in 2024-2025.

Highlights:

- **ELA Academic Performance:** 92% of students in grades 1-2 earned a B- or better or improved their ELA grade.
- **Kindergarten Academic Performance:** 89% of KG students earned an M in both math and ELA.
- **Math Academic Performance:** 80% of students in grade 1-2 earned a B- or better or improved their Math grade.

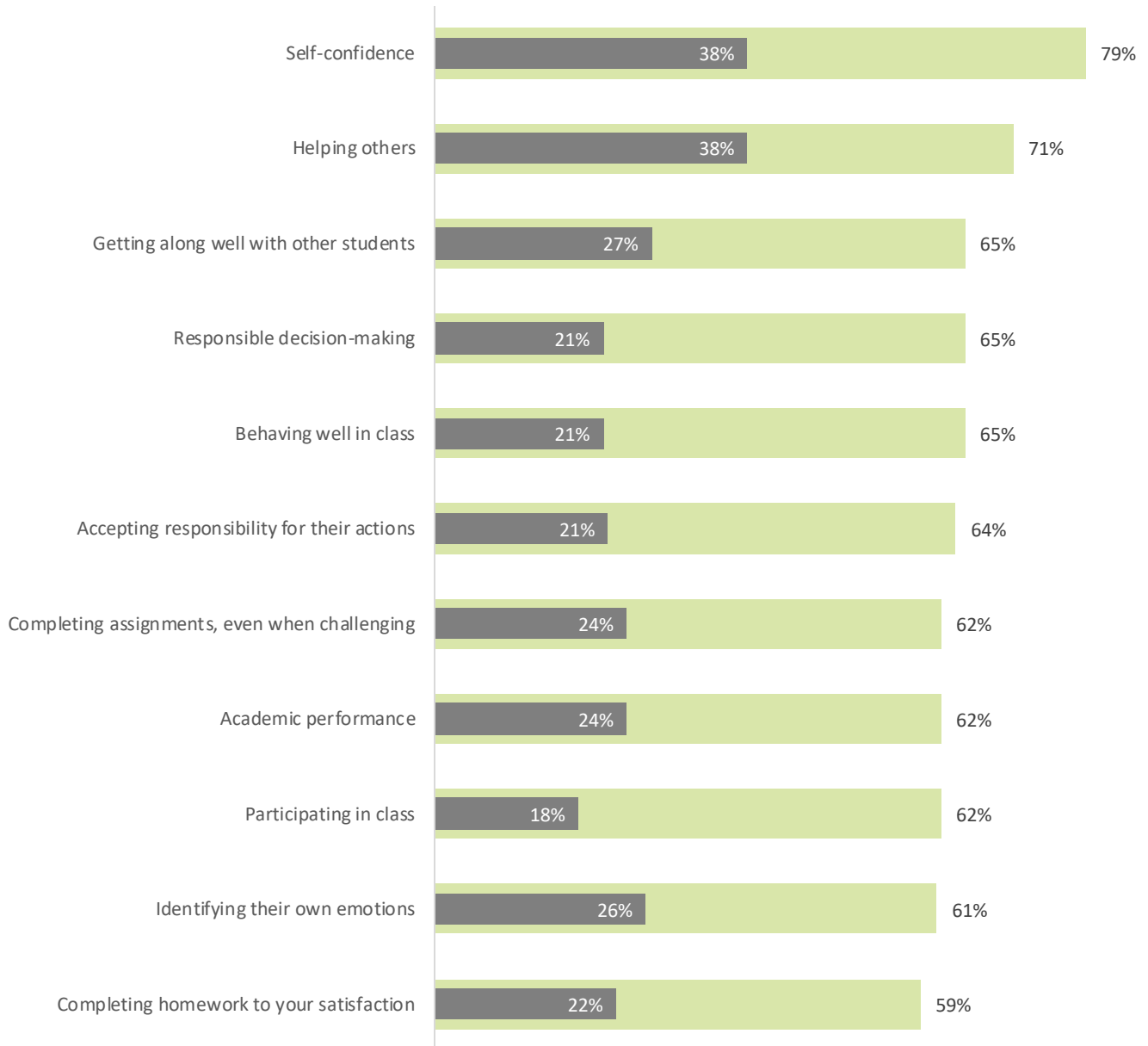


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Teacher Ratings of Student's Classroom Behaviors
