


GRADE LEVEL OF PARTICIPATING STUDENTS

Among students attending 45+ days in 2024-2025




ATTENDANCE

Eligibility for Free/Reduced Lunch









STUDENT SUCCESS

Academic and social/behavioral outcomes were measured for students who attended 45+ days in 2024-2025.

Highlights:

- Math Academic Performance: 100% of students earned a B- or better or improved their math grade
- ELA Academic Performance: 94% of students earned a B- or better or improved their ELA grade
- Homework Completion: 71% of students improved or did not need to improve completing homework as reports by teachers








Teacher Ratings of Student's Classroom Behaviors
