2024-2025 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

More than 2 million Hoosiers live in communities that do not have access to healthcare. The Indiana AHEC Network's mission is to improve health by recruiting, educating, and retaining healthcare professionals in underserved communities.

Hosted by the Hoosier Uplands Economic Development Corporation, the South Central Indiana (SCI) AHEC was established in 2003. SCI AHEC serves 12 counties: Brown, Clark, Crawford, Floyd, Harrison, Jackson, Lawrence, Martin, Monroe, Orange, Scott, and Washington.



Pathway Programs 362 Indiana students served

Pathway programs expose students to health careers and develop intent to pursue postsecondary education in primary healthcare professions.

- 86% students live in a rural community.
- 52% students are under-resourced.
- 68% plan to pursue a career in the health care field

Community-Based & Clinical Trainings 152 Indiana students served

Clinical training improves readiness, willingness, and ability of health profession trainees to serve in primary care, rural, and medically underserved communities.

- 69% of students plan to stay and practice in Indiana.
- 69% of students plan to practice primary care.
- 57% of students plan to practice in a rural community.
- 55% plan to practice behavioral health.

Indiana AHEC Scholars 38 Indiana students served

Indiana AHEC Scholars is a two-year intensive program designed to prepare future health professionals with the leadership skills necessary to better serve Hoosiers.

- 79% of students plan to stay and practice in Indiana.
- 47% of students plan to practice primary care.
- 71% of students plan to practice in a rural community.
- 42% plan to practice behavioral health.

Continuing education provides health professionals with access to resources to improve the quality of care for Hoosiers in rural and underserved communities.

Janine Martin's daughter, Nadine, gave birth to her 2nd grandchild January 1st @ 1:10pm!


Ivan was born 8lbs 5oz and 20" long. She said you can tell big sis is happy to see her baby brother. They're all doing great!


